WHAT WE DO

The Home & Community Care nurses and home health aides provide safe client-centred care and supportive services within FHQTC communities to support clients in their own home as long as possible.

SCOPE OF WORK

Specialized wound care, treatments based on physician orders, advanced foot care, palliative care and end-of-life care, medicine management, personal care (e.g. bathing), case management, assessment for long-term care, health education at Wellness Clinics, and home visits for elderly and those who live alone.





WHAT IS HOME CARE?

Home care is a program consisting of registered nurses (RNs), licensed practical nurses (LPNs), and home health aides (HHAs). Home care provides services to:

- Help people help themselves
- Provide services for people of any age living on reserve
- Help people to stay in their own home and be with loved ones as long as possible
- Work with other service providers to get the care that is needed

COMMUNITIES WE SERVE

The Home and Community Care program is operated out of the File Hills Qu'Appelle Tribal Council Health Services, located at All Nations' Healing Hospital

We offer services to 7 First Nations communities within the FHQ Tribal Council area:

- Nursing assessment - RN reviews health history and helps make a plan for care if needed

- Assist with navigating the health care system
- Follow up care from hospital to home
